

# RECONCILIATION ACTION PLAN 2023-2025

## Community Engagement Report Phase 2

### Overview

A Reconciliation Action Plan (RAP) is a guiding document for how our organisation will proceed on its reconciliation journey.




The Town of Victoria Park developed a vision for reconciliation for its Innovate RAP through community engagement and collaboration with the Mindeera Advisory Group and Elected Members over 2022. This aided a deep reflection of Town's reconciliation journey – the steps taken and the steps still to take. From these conversations arose a future commitment defined by courage, honesty and respect.

This report provides a snapshot of the second phase of consultation undertaken to seek confirmation from the community and key stakeholders that the Town correctly captured the needs of the community in developing the RAP and to make final adjustments depending on the feedback.

### Consultation process

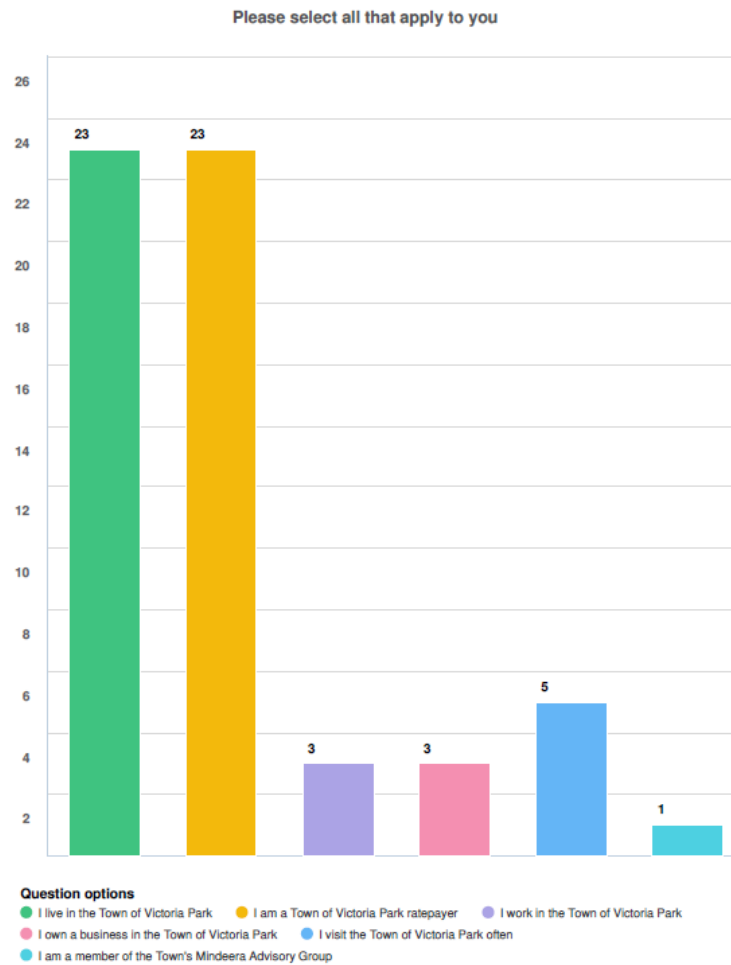
The second phase of engagement occurred between 23 October – 13 November 2023, seeking feedback from the community and key stakeholders on the following themes:

- Comments on the RAP document

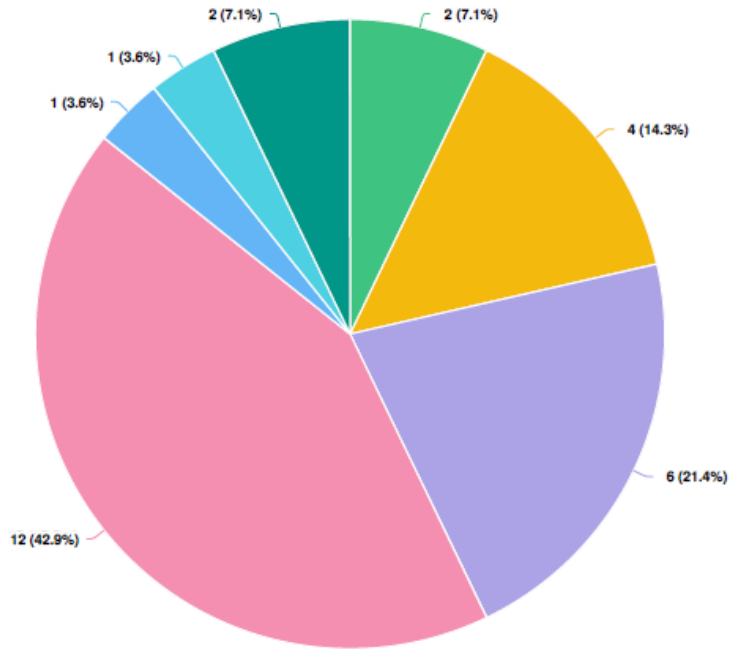

### Profile of survey respondents \* Please note the charts below to do not include statistics related to feedback received via email.



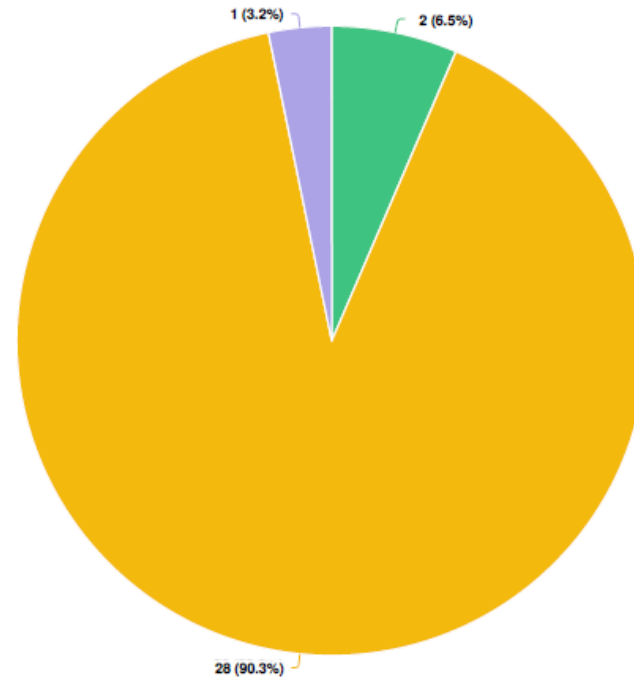
What suburb do you live in?

Do you identify as Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander?

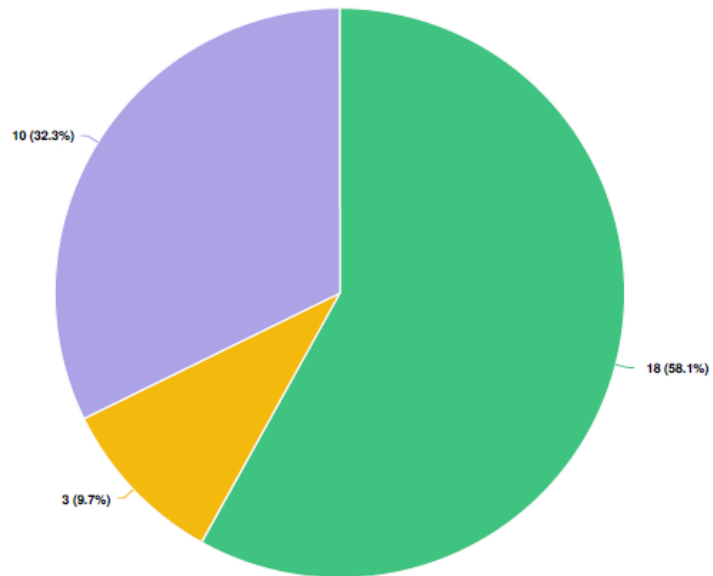

## Summary of feedback

Of the 33 responses to the public comment on the draft Innovate RAP, 20 were in favour of the plan with an additional 3 people in support but with concerns. Those that expressed support for the Innovate RAP made strong reconciliation statements and were keen for the Town to increase its messaging on activities and advocacy work in this area.

Those that said 'Yes, but I have some concerns' wanted an increased focus on meaningful engagement with First Nations people beyond those that sit on the Mindeera Advisory Group. They also wanted the Town to be more responsive and agile to cultural issues and be more direct in its support and empathy for trauma suffered by First Nations People. Lastly, they wanted a more succinct RAP document.

Ten respondents were not in support of the RAP with common feedback themes being that they felt it was divisive and that they felt the recent Referendum was an indicator showing there was not a need for a RAP locally.

Document reviewed and tracked changes presented in Final RAP Draft for consideration following the public comment period, noting that the Town's Mindeera Advisory Group and Reconciliation Australia has reviewed and approved the content and relevance of the RAP from a cultural perspective. Feedback not relating to the RAP document has been noted and will be incorporated into the RAP implementation plan.
