Purpose of the item

To discuss and the confirm the groups preferred shortlisted options to form the business case analysis for the location of a new facility for Victoria Park Xavier Hockey Club.

Outcome

The group to recommend to Administration a preferred list of shortlisted options for a Business Case for a location of a new facility for Victoria Park Xavier Hockey Club.

Discussion points

Following further investigations and analysis by the Town, the group to discuss and arrive at a preferred suitability rating for the following options:

- Somerset Park (East Victoria Park) - Poor
- Charles Paterson Park (Burswood South) - Strong
- G.O. Edwards Park (Burswood South) – Poor/Fair
- McCallum Reserve and Taylor Park (Victoria Park) - Fair
- Burswood Park – Southern Nine (Burswood Peninsula) Met with CEO (other plans)
- Curtin University – Hockey WA (Curtin/Bentley) – Strong
- Purchasing Land – Poor – LAOS look at Town reserves - Poor
- Unidentified location in the City of Belmont – Poor/Fair (Sporting needs) distance
- Unidentified location in the City of Canning Investigate – Poor/Fair distance
- Unidentified location in the City of South Perth – Poor/Fair

The nature of the group's discussion is outlined below:

- Support preferred short list options for a business case
- Correspondence from Hockey WA outlined by Town
- Discussed the content in a future Business case
- Confirmed that the Group support the following options be presented to Council - Charles Paterson /GO Edwards Park, Curtin Uni, McCallum & Taylor – Aim for Report to Council in March 2022
- Discussed the process from here – consultant, design consideration. Community involvement/engagement, technical complications, services, cost implications.
- Potential community concerns over night lighting at Taylor/McCallum Park
- Community engagement is a preferred option for the Town in some capacity

- A business case should consider events on the Taylor/McCallum Park and the financial impact of them.
- Consider consultation on the 3 reserves and then further detailed consultation to be a key component of further work on the preferred option.
- Further discussion occurred regarding the process for community engagement

Strategic outcomes

CL03 - Well thought out and managed projects that are delivered successfully.	Council endorsed shortlisted options will inform a future business case. The future business case will explore the options in significant detail and arrive at a preferred location for a hockey facility.
EN05 - Appropriate and sustainable facilities for everyone that are well built, well maintained and well managed.	The shortlisted options are a precursor to a business case that will explore and recommend a facility that is appropriate for the Hockey Club, but also the Town and the broader community's needs.

- Confirmation on shortlisted options to be presented to Council
- Provide a draft schedule (timeframe) to the HWG.
