Agonis flexuosa

WA Weeping Peppermint

height: 15m

fauna: Insects, birds, frogs, mammals and reptiles



Medium sized evergreen tree. Dome shaped weeping habit. Forms somewhat out of proportion and has a fibrous trunk with low branches. Ideal climbing tree. White flowers resembling those of the teatree.

Allocasuarina fraseriana

fauna: Insects, birds, and reptiles



Upright tree with long needle like branchlets. Flowers from May - Oct with reddish-brown flowers. Fiberous flakey bark.

Banksia attenuata

Candle Stick Banksia

height: 6m

and reptiles




Small tree with showy display of yellow, candle-like flowers from spring to autumn. An ideal specimen tree with bird and marsupial attracting flowers. Thrives in any well drained soil in full sun or part shade position. Prune after flowering but do not cut into the old wood

Bull Banksia

golden flowers during spring and summer. Bird attracting, butterfly attracting.

Banksia ilicfolia

Holly Leaved Banksia

height: 10m

fauna: Insects, birds, mammals

A medium sized tree. Flowers from at the ends of the branch. Growth colours ranging from yellow to red. In bloom from Jan - Dec.



Banksia menziesii

Firewood Banksia

height: 5m

fauna: Insects, birds, mammals

and reptiles



Tree or shrub to 2-6m high. Red, yellow flowers during autumn and winter. Bird attracting (including Carnaby Cockatoos), butterfly attracting, Prune after flowering but do not cut into the old wood as the flowers come from the new growth.



If stock is unavailable for a particular plant variety a similar plant substitution may be made for that pack.

Corymbia calophylla

Marri

height: 25m

fauna: Insects, birds, mammals and reptiles

This beautiful flowering tree in cultivation makes a large-sized tree with a dense rounded crown. In summer it bears large clusters of creamy white or rarely pink flowers followed by urn-shaped capsules. Best suited to moist well-drained soil



Eucalyptus marginata

Jarrah

height: 40m

fauna: Insects, birds, mammals and reptiles

Slow growing erect tree. Bark is brown and fiberous growing in a vertical linear formation. Clusters of white-cream flowers in bloom in Declor Ian.



Eucalyptus todtiana

Prickly Bark

height: 15m

fauna: Insects, birds, mammals and reptiles



Slow growing erect tree. Clusters of white-cream flowers in bloom in Jan – April. Well suited from sandy to laterite soils.

Hakea laurina

Pincushion Hakea/Kodjet

height: 4.5m

fauna: insects birds, reptiles, frogs and mammals.

A small tree, with long slender leaves, producing pinkish red, medium sized seaurchin like flowers from April – Aug. Grows in sandy to clay soils.




Melaleuca lanceolata

A medium sized tree often found in the lower lying areas of the coastal plane. The tree can get up to 8m tall and 5m wide with a white paperbark trunk and white flowers during summer, attracting birds and bees.

This tree is a root parasite that eventually takes over the host tree with thick succulent type leaves. Prolific golden yellow flowers bloom from Oct – Jan

Slow growing tree like structure. White-cream flowers from Jun – Aug
