DESIGN REFERENCE GROUP WORKSHOP 1 - SUMMARY

The Town of Victoria Park advertised for expressions of interest for community members to form part of Design Reference Group (DRG). The DRG also included representatives of key stakeholder groups.

PLACE laboratory with ABV and the Town of Victoria Park lead a workshop involving the DRG on the 12th of March 2020 with 23 of the 26 members in attendance. The workshop participants were tasked to;

- / Determine the core values and themes relating to Higgins Park and Playfield Reserve
- / Develop the aspirations relating to Higgins Park and Playfield Reserve
- / Identify the key factors that will enable the successful revitalisation Higgins Park and Playfield Reserve
- / Explore the key barriers that will need to be overcome to revitalise Higgins Park and Playfield Reserve

The workshop was delivered in four main sessions which are outlined below;

Session 3 - Aspirations




