Causeway Pedestrian and Cyclist Bridges

Limestone stockpile at McCallum Park

As construction continues for the Causeway Pedestrian and Cyclist Bridges Project, landscaping is underway at McCallum Park, in preparation for the work site to become public open space at the end of 2024. A large volume of limestone was imported to the McCallum Park work site to provide temporary roads, laydown areas and solid ground for the cranes to sit on (crane pads).

Now that bridge construction from the McCallum Park work site is nearly complete, the excess limestone is being removed from the work site by truck, stockpiled and given to the Town of Victoria Park to reuse as part of the McCallum Park Active Area Project (the Project). The Federally and State-funded Project will transform the park into a significant recreation destination, boasting a range of sporting facilities alongside dedicated spaces to meet, host community events and celebrate cultural diversity. Planned facilities include "hype-court" art-style basketball courts, a BMX pump track, and a skate/scooter park.

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- Trucking activity will be stop-start over several months, between the standard work hours of 7am and 7pm.
- Access to footpaths will not be affected.
- This work has received relevant approvals and tree protection zones are in place.
- The stockpile will remain until approximately October 2024, when it will be used to form the new skate plaza and BMX pump track.
