This year brings some eagerly awaited changes to the way we manage your household waste.

The biggest change is the rollout of the Food Organics and Garden Organics (FOGO) three-bin system. It's time for everyone to get their third bin, if you

haven't already got one. FOGO will turn your food scraps and garden waste into compost, instead of sending it to landfill.

Following ongoing issues with our scheduled bulk verge collections, we're introducing Verge Valet™ – a convenient, pre-booked collection service for both green and hard waste.

These changes reflect our commitment to more sustainable services, supporting our Climate Emergency Plan goal of net zero emissions by 2030, and our Strategic Waste Minimisation Plan target of diverting all waste from landfill.

Delivering high-quality waste services and helping our community reduce waste contributes to a healthier, more liveable Town. While new services will make disposal easier, the most effective way to reduce our environmental impact is to create less waste in the first place – by choosing reusables, repairing before replacing, and recycling more. It's better for our community, and better for the planet.

FOOD WASTE

Including coffee grounds, meat, fish bones, egg shells and dairy

Lawn clippings, small branches, flowers, weeds, leaves etc

With AS4736 or AS5810 compostable symbols only

Kitchen caddy instructions

The kitchen caddy is used to collect food scraps in the kitchen before you place them in your FOGO bin.



Caddy

Line your caddy with a certified compostable liner, or go nude with no liner.



Food scraps

Place your food scraps in the caddy with other compostable materials like coffee grounds.



FOGO bin

Once your caddy is full, tie up the liner and place it in your FOGO bin.

Your caddy is dishwasher safe. Just pop the lid off as colours may fade on the stamp.

When buying more caddy liners, look for the Australian Standard Compostable symbols (AS5810 or AS4736) to ensure your liners contain no plastic.



'Compostable' cups and packaging should go in your General Waste Bin. Many contain PFAS substances – a 'forever' chemical that isn't good for our compost.



The things you just can't bin

Hazardous waste

Items like batteries, paint, household chemicals, aerosol cans and gas canisters are hazardous. They're often flammable, toxic, explosive or corrosive, so they must not go in household bins.

To help you safely dispose of these items, the Town holds free hazardous waste drop-off days throughout the year.

Other tricky waste items:

Mattresses

Each household is eligible for two free mattress collections per year – book a collection at vicpark.info/mattresses



Batteries, printer cartridges, globes & mobile phones

Drop these at the Town's admin building (99 Shepperton Road, Vic Park) or Leisurelife (248 Gloucester Street, East Vic Park).



E-waste

Anything with a plug, battery or cord is banned from landfill. E-waste cannot be disposed of in your household bins. Check vicpark.info/e-waste for the latest safe disposal options.

Verge Valet™

The Town now offers a pre-booked collection service for green and bulk waste. Instead of waiting for scheduled verge collections, you can now choose a collection time that works best for you with Verge Valet™.

Why pre-booked?

Pre-booked services are more flexible, reduce wastage and reduce illegal dumping.

How many collections can I book?

Each property can book up to three total collections per financial year, with a maximum of two bulk waste collections. This could look like **2 bulk + 1 green, 1 bulk + 2 green, or 0 bulk + 3 green.**



You can place up to three cubic metres of waste on your verge for each collection (no skip bins are used). Unused collections don't roll over to the next financial year.

What should I do before I book?

- ✓ Check which items are eligible for collection.
- ✓ Rehome anything that could still be useful to someone (consider op shops, Marketplace and local Buy-Nothing groups).
- ✓ Don't place items out on the verge until 1-3 days before collection.

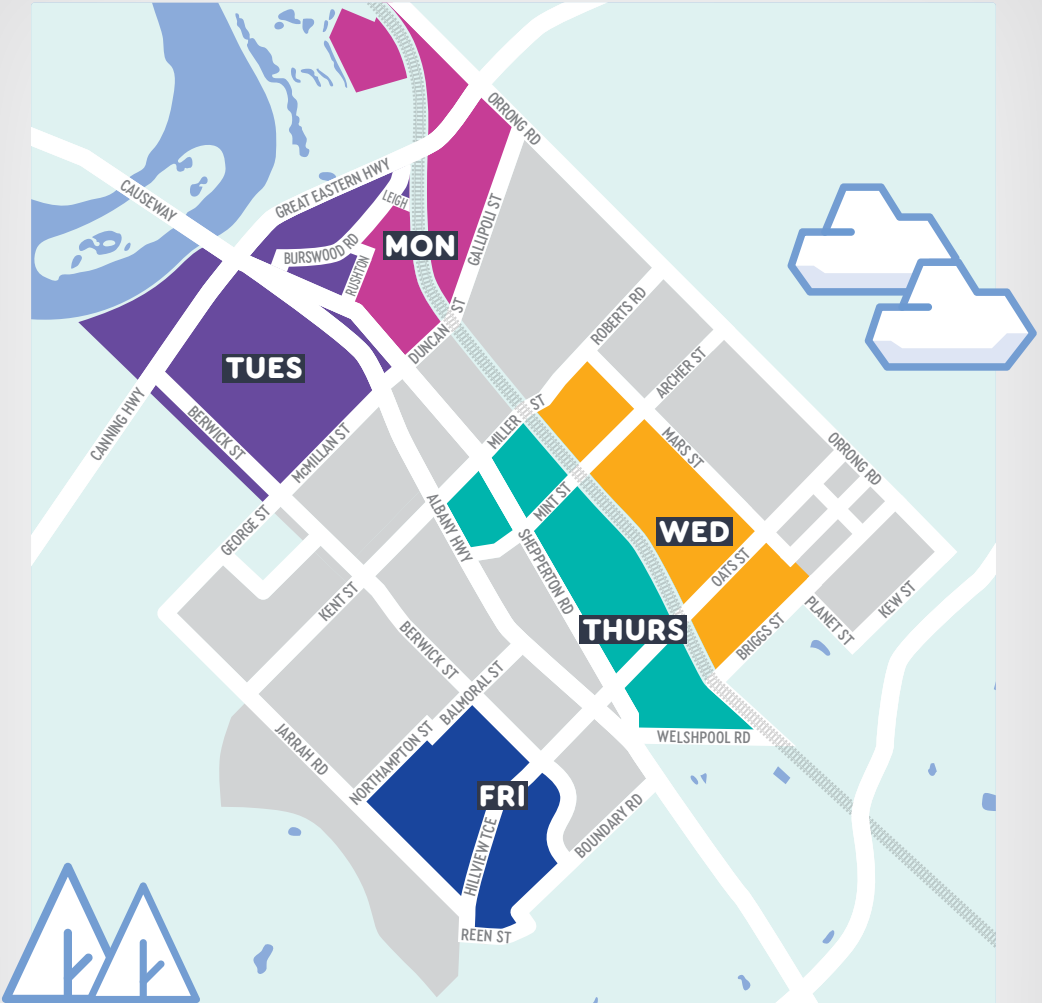

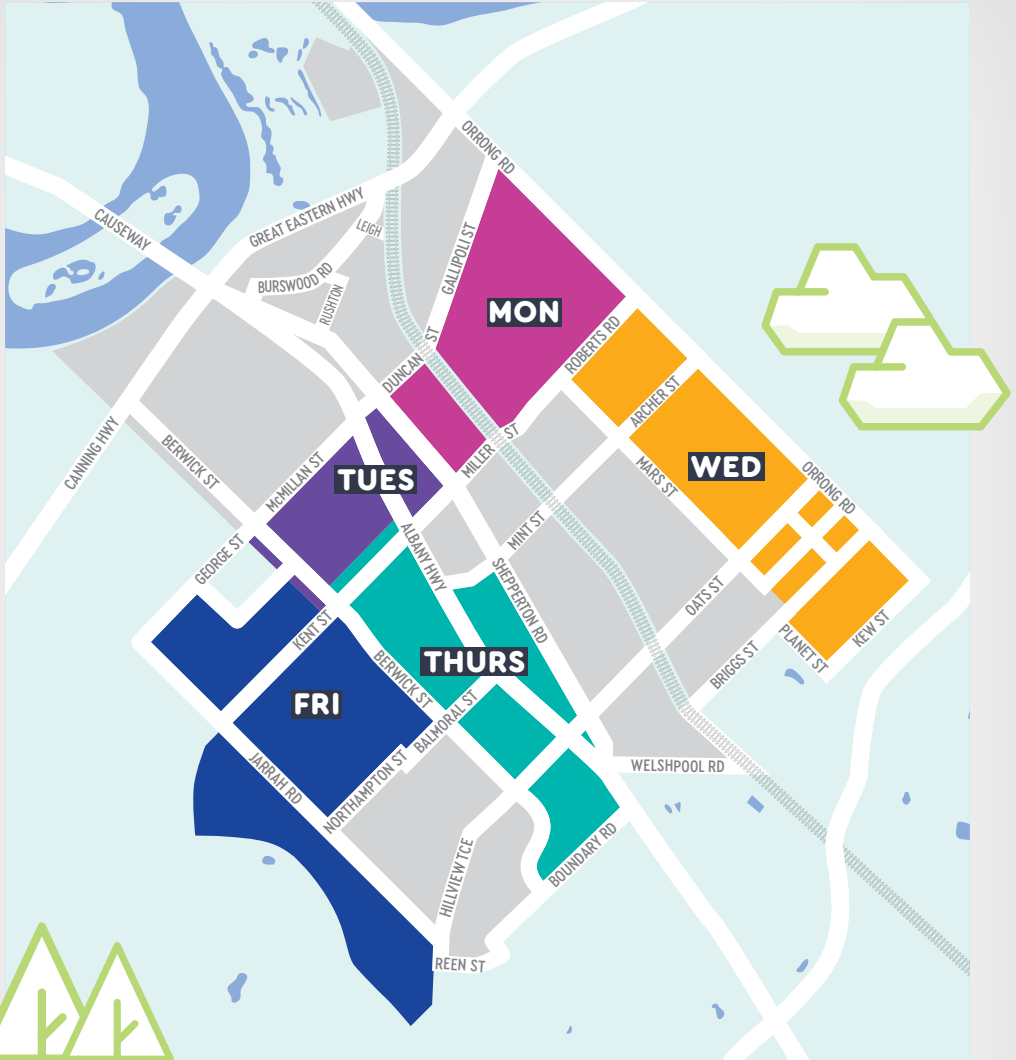
