- Officers presented a detailed overview of plans for, and values that are relevant to the future growth and development of the Albany Highway Precinct.
- Officers clarified the constraints that attend to this project insofar as they sit within State Government Planning Policy and Precinct Design Guidelines.
- Officers requested input from Mindeera Members and Noongar community members, on the Aboriginal stories, historical and current, on this area and surrounds. Officers also sought input on how these stories should be told and how culture should be acknowledged and respected.
- Feedback was provided by Mindeera Group members, on the need to integrate and preserve current green space, mature trees, and space for fauna, in forthcoming changes to this area. Suggestions were made to amend the private land policy so that mature trees could be protected on private land, from infill development.
- Emphasis was given by Mindeera group members that stories of this area are not particular to the highway, as this was not a Noongar boundary, but traverse areas that extend beyond the parameters of suburbs and LGA defined areas.
- Advice was given by Mindeera Members and external consultants that genuine designing of country (including active address of decolonisation in 'place') needs to be central to the Structure Plan.

- Officers to coordinate a Workshop that continues this discussion to include Mindeera Members and Whadjuk Cultural Advice Committee members.
- Mindeera Member to circulate details of Whadjuk Cultural Advice Committee to Reconciliation officer.
