The Advisory Group reviewed and supported the following Noongar language words for the renaming for Row52:

Koorliny (walking) Lane, Whadjuk (local Noongar traditional landowner) Way/Lane, Bidee (path) – Bidee with the preferred spelling – Bidi.

Bidi was the overall preferred name from the Group.

The Group did not support Wadju Bidee and Towindri.

Zone 2X - Koobardie had the highest vote of 59% out of the three selected names by community members.

The project manager for this project wanted to thank to Advisory Group for their support and efforts on this naming process.

Work instruction is in draft form and requires additional consultation internally.

Actions

- The Town's project manager will include the Groups preferred naming and spelling details in the Council report.
- Town officers to seek clarity on who makes the final decision on the naming for Zone 2x and are three names still provided to Landgate.
- Keep the naming process on the agenda during the term of the current Mindeera group for updates on this topic.
- Details of the work instruction to be brought back to the group at the next meeting.
