Four years since Council adopted our community-led Urban Forest Strategy for implementation, our various #GreeningVicPark activities and programs have delivered many positive and powerful social, environmental, health and community outcomes.

A summary of our 2022 planting season

Below is a summary of how our 2022 Urban Forest program contributed to the six strategic outcomes outlined in our Implementation Action Plan. Access the full report at vicpark.info/ufreports (see QR code).

Strategic Outcome 1: achieve 20% tree canopy target. In 2022, we planted 3,386 trees and 21,822 shrubs, contributing to an extra 111,697m² of projected canopy cover.

Strategic Outcome 2: maximise community involvement. We've worked with our residents and community this planting season through our Urban Forest at Home and Green Basins programs and community planting days.

Strategic Outcome 3: increase tree diversity. A total of 40 tree species and 44 shrub species were planted as part of our 2022 planting season.

Strategic Outcome 4: improve vegetation health. We're helping to maintain our urban forest health through our citizen science program, our bi-annual GIS mapping and selection of climate resilient planting stock and species.

Strategic Outcome 5: improve water and soil quality. We are using permeable paving innovation and a series of bushland restoration techniques to support our urban forest growth.

Strategic Outcome 6: improve urban ecosystems. We've planted at public areas, parks, and verges using flora propagated from remaining natural, local bushland. Additionally, 33 bird waterers have been installed across 18 local governments, providing clean and low maintenance water sources for our local fauna.





Microparks: Sumps in these locations have been turned into community micro parks through our Green Basins program: vicpark.info/greenbasins



Community planting 1: Residents, community groups and businesses joined our NAIDOC themed Community Planting Day 1 on Sunday 3 July 2022.



Community planting 2: 120+ residents, community members and volunteer groups from all over Perth took time out to help plant trees and shrubs at Kent St Verge, as part of National Tree Day.



Staff Planting Day: Town staff participated in the first ever Staff Planting Day at Kent St Verge.



Leafy streets Vic Park: This initiative continues the planting of appropriately selected species of trees in suitably identified street verges around the Town's suburbs.



Bus Stop Thank You Garden:

We've transformed another bus stop in Town, from its typical concrete surroundings into a 'garden' with plants and trees.



Urban ecosystems: We've increased tree and shrub planting in these parks, verges and public areas around Town for a healthier urban environment.



Bird waterers: Our Town designed and developed bird waterers ensure that there are safe, clean, and low maintenance water sources for the many bird species that visit our urban ecosystems.

2022 Urban Forest program highlights

Let's take a look at some of our Urban Forest program's unique and notable achievements, achieved through a collaborative approach between our Town staff, residents, community members and businesses.

🌿 Vic Park Leafy Streets:

This year, the Town's Urban Forest team worked with our contractors to plant 1,061 appropriately selected species of street trees, contributing to 58,255m² projected canopy cover.



🌿 Urban Forest at Home:

In 2022, our community members and residents continued to embrace planting trees and shrubs at home, contributing to 20,441m² projected canopy cover. A total of 1,075 tree seedlings and 6,120 local native shrubs were collected for home planting.



🌿 Community planting days:


250+ community members participated in two community planting days in 2022 (coinciding with NAIDOC and National Tree Day Celebrations). Our community planted 257 trees and 10,349 shrubs, adding 7,428m² projected canopy cover.



🌿 At Kent St Verge our community helped to:

Build over a hectare of rehabilitated urban landscape for local wildlife to move freely from Jirdarup Bushland to other urban habitats beyond Hayman Rd.

Connect our Kent St Verge planting corridor, known roosts for the 'Endangered' Carnaby Cockatoo and the 'Vulnerable' Forest Red-tailed Cockatoo.



🌿 Vic Park Green Basins:

Residents on Esperance, Huntingdon and Merton Streets helped turn Sumps into micro parks for all of us to enjoy! A total of 30 trees and 900 shrubs were planted, adding 1,021m² of projected canopy cover.



🌿 Urban ecosystems:

At Fraser Park, Carlisle Extension, Harold Rossiter, George St Reserve and other identified Town areas, we planted 1,250 trees and 37,096 shrubs, contributing to 38,597m² projected canopy cover.



🌿 Urban Forest Grants Program:

Our grant recipients from Millen Primary School, Perth Individual College and Kent Street Senior High School Parent and Citizens Association continue to care for and grow their trees as part of their winning planting projects.



🌿 WA Tree Festival:

With other local government councils, we went 'beyond the bark' at WA's first ever tree festival, from 9 April - 9 May 2022. Five community events, including four 'Vic Park Green Future' workshops and Kensington Bushland guided tour with Friends of Jirdarup were delivered. 🌿 Urban centres greening:

16 locations were upgraded along Albany highway installing street trees with permeable paving surrounds, allowing water runoff to infiltrate back into the ground.



Our award winning #GreeningVicPark initiatives

The 2022 planting season saw our Urban Forest program win big at various greening, industry and sustainability awards

The recognition of our Urban Forest program is made possible through the ongoing support, passion and commitment of our residents and community members who continue to collaborate with us in #GreeningVicPark

- 🌿 **Australian Institute of Landscape Architecture (AILA) WA 2002 Awards:** Our Urban Forest program took out the top awards for this year's WA Australian Institute of Landscape Architecture award (July 2022): Award Excellence in the Infrastructure Category and the WA Medal.
- 🌿 **Tree Cities of the World status renewal:** In May, the Food and Agriculture Organisation of the United Nations and the Arbor Day Foundation, congratulated the Town of Victoria Park for renewing its Tree City of the World Status – still the only council in WA to earn this recognition.
- 🌿 **Australian Institute of Landscape Architecture (AILA) WA Awards:** Our Urban Forest program took out the top prize – Award of Excellence – in the Community Contribution category, recognising how our Urban Forest program contributes to the Town's social infrastructure and inter- and intra- generational opportunities.
- 🌿 **International Association of Horticultural Producers (AIPH) 2022 World Green City Awards:** We received a Highly Commended Award for the Biodiversity Category, with Paris and Bogota.
- 🌿 **Institute of Public Administration WA (IPAA):** We are a finalist for the innovative design of our Bird Waterers.



🌿 **Urban Forest at Home: Online orders will open on 27 April 2023 until resources are fully allocated.** Pick up at Town Depot on 27 May 2023 (9am – 3pm).

Our ever popular Urban Forest at Home program will make a comeback in 2023, offering residents free tree seedlings and shrubs, most of which have been propagated from Jirdarup Bushland to encourage endemic species to "jump the fence" and increase our biodiversity.




