## Security Incentive Storyboard



We invested **\$36,417** 



...across 104 households



...to subsidise installation of **329** security devices



...resulting in **73%** of funding recipients feeling safer\* and contributing to helping people feel safe in our community.

### Security Incentive Scheme Scorecard

By incentivising community to install security devices, we reduce opportunities for crime and contribute to helping people feel safe (S1).

### How much did we do?

- \$36,417 funding provided
- 104 rebates granted
- 53 more rebates granted than in 2022-23
- 329 devices installed
- 2 new devices added to the scheme

### How well did we do it?

How safe did you feel before and after installing a security device?

	Before	After
Very unsafe	4	0
Unsafe	22	5
Neutral	42	16
Safe	29	57
Very safe	1	20

- 79% of recipients felt safe or very safe after installing a subsidised security device, an increase of 48%
- 5% of people still feel unsafe after installing a subsidised security device, an improvement of 17%
