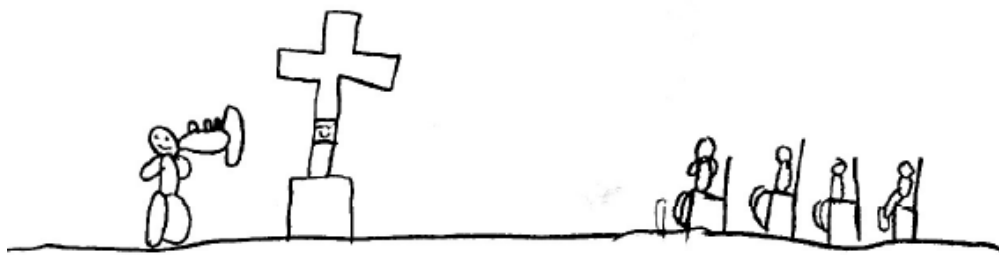

Amazing research by the Local History Librarian for the accurate and appropriate information about the featured soldier in the speech and brochure provided to the community.

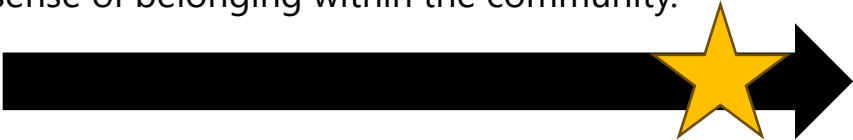




Remembrance Day 2024 Scorecard
