We delivered a series of Skate Clinics that included:

A Girls & Gender Diverse session



... and an All-Gender Inclusive session



... that included individualised coaching,



... to build practical skills, safety knowledge



and confidence



... so that young people in the Town of Victoria Park can **engage more in positive recreation, develop peer connections,** and **feel safer and more included in skatepark settings,** **contributing to** an increased sense of safety and belonging to the community for young people in the Town of Victoria Park.

How much did we do?

3 Skate Clinics:

1 for 5-12 year olds

2 for 12-25 year olds

Each clinic split into two 50 minute rotations:

- Girls & Gender Diverse session
- All-Gender Inclusive session

Total of 104 attendees across the 3 clinics.

How well did we do it?

100% of respondents rated the event as Excellent

Survey respondents rated ...

- their feeling of connection at **89%***
- their feeling of being heard and understood at **92%***
- their feeling of being included and accepted at **96%***
- an increase in their sense of belonging at **95%***

** average weighted from 7 responses.*

Strong female participation in:

- Skateboarding: 40-50%
- Scooter: 35-50%
- Rollerblade/skate: 50-60%

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Theory of Change: By delivering a series of skate clinics, we helped young people build practical skills, safety knowledge and confidence, so that they can **engage more in positive recreation, develop peer connections**, and **feel safer and more included in skatepark settings**, contributing to an increased sense of safety and belonging to the community.
