

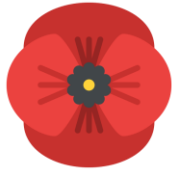

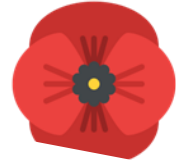

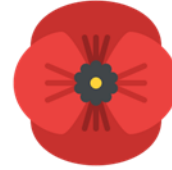
41 children from Victoria Park Primary School shared their knowledge of Remembrance Day before and after the service.

Feedback from Victoria Park school children

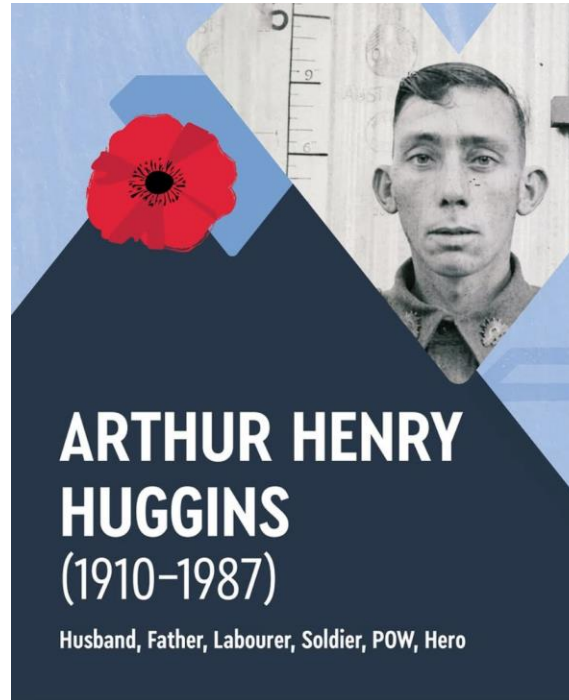


The majority of children shared that they learnt about the **local impact of global conflict:**

lived in Victoria Park.

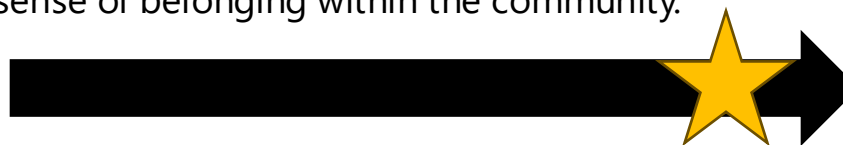
Yes because I learned that
